How to recruit the right employee effectively

Your church can grow and prosper without having to spend a huge amount on recruiting costs. The keys to finding the right staff are in creating a recruitment plan and then implementing that plan on a daily basis. A recruitment plan is like a marketing plan, but one that is made for potential staff members. How effectively your church markets itself to the community determines the size of the congregation and budget and, therefore, the services you can provide. Likewise, how well your church markets itself to potential staffers determines your ability to market to the community and provide services. Would you begin marketing for parishioners the day you want them to experience your church? Of course not! But that's what most churches do when recruiting personnel — they wait until they need a staff member before they start looking for one.

The recruitment plan

The first step in developing a recruitment plan is to target your market. Here are some questions to ask:

· Who are our potential staff members?

You can target your market by looking at those who have been successful in carrying out their previous assignments. You may need to make several recruitment plans if the tasks and responsibilities required by the position are very diverse. Ask yourself what tasks did that person successfully complete? What are their skills, experiences and background? List your answers and a picture of who you're looking for will emerge.

· What makes us attractive to potential staff?

You need to know this so you can create an organization that has the qualities that your target is seeking. This information is best gathered from current and past members of your staff and those applicants you wanted but didn't want you. Ask your team the following questions: Why would someone want to work here? Why did you come to work here? Why do you stay? What are the 10 benefits of working with us? When you develop this list of benefits, it will serve two purposes: It will give existing staff members something

specific to discuss when they talk to a potential employee, and it will be a great source of motivation for them, something that will remind them why they enjoy working with your church.

Recruiting strategies

Choose recruiting strategies that will attract only the people you want. This may be frightening at first because this method may not net a lot of responses; however, those responses will be coming from the right people.

If you use strategies that are specific to your target, chances are great that you will attract who you are looking for. You may end up having more qualified candidates than you can hire. Your plan needs to include maintaining a line of communication or connection with them just in case a new need comes up.

Assessment techniques

Plan what assessment, selection and closing (job offering) techniques you'll use so your church and the jobs you are offering are attractive to your target. For example, asking the candidate to come to your office for two or more interviews may be cumbersome and thus make you less attractive.

Remember, planning takes time and implementing the strategies takes time. But if you want to hire the right person, you'll set up an effective recruitment system. It will be worth your investment in time and resources.
